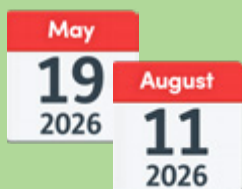

Introduction



Thank you for reading this information and sharing your views.



It was an honour to listen to your experiences, ideas and hopes with us last year.



The Grenfell Memory Project started after an agreement was made in 2023.

The agreement was between people who made legal claims after the Grenfell Tower fire in North Kensington and several organisations, including London Fire Brigade.



The project is part of a wider plan to help people heal and move forward.

This project wants to:

- Help rebuild trust between London Fire Brigade and the people and communities affected by the Grenfell Tower fire.
- Remember and honour the people who died.
- Create a lasting way to remember the Grenfell Tower fire for future generations.





London Fire Brigade wants to hear from people about the Grenfell Memory Project.



The Grenfell Tower fire happened on 14 June 2017.



72 people died in the fire.



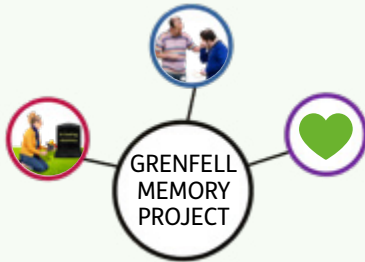
Many families, survivors and local people are still affected today.



The Grenfell Memory Project is part of work to remember the people who died and support the community.



The project was planned with families, survivors and local residents.



The project aims to remember people who died, and do things that make a long term positive change.

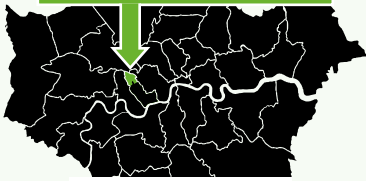
£8.25 million

London Fire Brigade has put **£8.25 million** ready for this project.



The money will go to memory projects from close family members, community projects and support local people.

North Kensington



London

The project is for North Kensington and Grenfell communities.



That includes:

- Close family members of the people who died. This includes husbands, wives, partners, parents, children, brothers, sisters, grandparents, grandchildren and another family member chosen by the family
- People who survived the Grenfell Tower fire.
- People who lived within 500 metres of Grenfell Tower.
- Other family members of the 72 people who died.
- People who lived in Grenfell Tower when the fire happened but have moved away.
- People living in the North Kensington areas of Golborne, Colville, Notting Dale, St Helen's and Dalgarno when this project takes place.
- People who made legal claims after the Grenfell Tower fire.



Some people have moved away from the area but are still included.



The project is also for young people affected by Grenfell.



London Fire Brigade wants people to have their say before the final plans are decided.

There will be a 5-year grants programme.

There are 3 types of grants:

- Personal Memory Grants.
- Grants for young people affected by Grenfell.
- Community Resilience Grants.

Personal Memory Grants



Some grants will help families remember loved ones in personal ways.



Families may use grants for memorials, activities or special projects.



£3 million

£3 million is planned for these personal memory grants.

Grants for young people affected by Grenfell



There will also be grants for young people affected by Grenfell. The project is to help healing and create activities for young people to do well in their careers, life generally and have positive experiences.



Young people can apply for help with education, training or life opportunities.



£1 million

Some young people with additional needs, affected by Grenfell, may also get support. £1 million is planned for these grants.

Community resilience grants



£1 million

Community groups may also apply for grants. There is £1 million for grants.



These grants are for community groups that help people who were most affected by the Grenfell tragedy and activities linked to Grenfell remembrance.

2. A five-year residential and day activity programme



There will be activities for young people aged 11 to 15.



These activities may include trips, sports, learning and group activities.



The aim is to help young people make friends and build confidence and life skills.

600



Around 600 young people could take part over 5 years.



£1.5 million

£1.5 million is planned for this programme.

3. A 5-year fire safety careers programme



There will also be a fire safety careers programme.



People can learn about jobs in fire safety



The programme will include workshops and career advice.



Some people will get support to study for a fire safety qualification.

Training costs will be fully paid for by the project.



£300,000

£300,000 is planned for this fire safety programme.

4. Helping to stop future disasters



The project also wants to help stop future disasters.



Grenfell stories may be included in training for building and safety professionals.



£300,000

£300,000 is planned for education and training resources.

5. A possible community hub for young people in the Grenfell area



Many people asked for a community hub near Grenfell Tower. This would have a focus on young people.



A community hub could be a safe place for people to meet and get support.



There will be a study to see if a community hub is possible.



The study will look at the cost, where it could be built and long-term plans.



£60,000

£60,000 is planned for this study.



£1 million

£1 million will be kept for the ideas that come out of the consultation and the feasibility study.



The project will continue to work with families and local people.



The grants programme may be run by an independent organisation.



This is to make sure decisions are fair and clear.



The programmes will be developed together with close families of those who died, survivors and the local community.



Staff supporting young people may get mental health training.

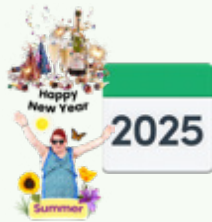
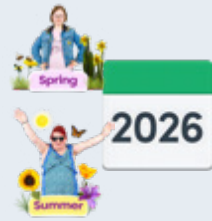
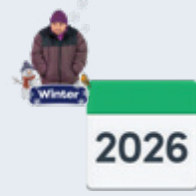


London Fire Brigade will pay for all the project running costs of the Grenfell Memory Project.

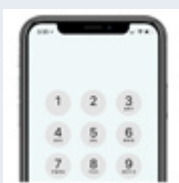

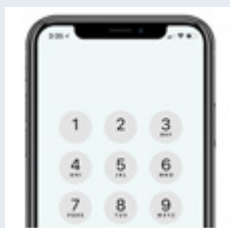
